Vulnerable Sector Police Information Check

▪ *Security Clearance*

The Vulnerable Sector Police Information Check includes a check of local police records to determine the existence of a pattern of behavior that may result in harm to vulnerable persons. In order for us to provide the most accurate information, it is important for us to ensure the applicant is a resident of Edmonton and/or the surrounding jurisdictions we are authorized to do a Vulnerable Sector search. This is to ensure that vulnerable people are safe from victimization. The RCMP jurisdictions we have authorization to do Vulnerable Sector searches are:

- Spruce Grove
- Stony Plain
- Beaumont
- Sherwood Park
- St. Albert
- Morinville
- Fort Saskatchewan
- Leduc

Effective **July 1, 2018**, documentation must be provided showing the applicant resides in Edmonton or one of the RCMP jurisdictions listed above.

****NEW JULY 1ST, 2018. APPLICANTS FOR THE VULNERABLE SECTOR POLICE INFORMATION CHECK ARE REQUIRED TO SHOW ALSO SUBMIT PROOF OF ADDRESS.****

EXAMPLES OF PROOF OF RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS ARE:

- Alberta Driver's license,
- Alberta Identification card,
- Utility bill,
- Bank/Credit Card statements,
- Property Rental Agreement/Mortgage documents,
- Car registration/Insurance,
- Post-secondary school registration,
- Recent online shopping invoices,
- Food delivery purchases.

The documentation must bear the applicants **name & current address** and **dated within the last 90 days** however, does not need to be an original. Please be advised that P.O. BOX addresses are **NOT** accepted, a physical address must be provided.

IN ADDITION THE APPLICANT MUST ALSO SUBMIT TWO (2) PIECES OF GOVERNMENT ISSUED ID:

- Driver's License,
- Birth Certificate,
- Passport,
- Immigration ID Card,
- Citizenship Card,
- Indian/ Metis Status Card,
- National Defense Card,
- Permanent Resident Card,
- Fire Arms Card,
- Alberta Health Card
